CAR SEAT SAFETY

A properly used child safety seat is required if the child is less than 8 years old AND weighs less than 80 pounds. Most parents and other caregivers will be able to comply using belt-positioning booster seats for children between 40 and 80 pounds. The child must be within the weight range for the child restraint/booster seat, and the seat must meet Federal Standards in effect at the time of manufacture.

The most important tip:

Keep your child rear facing for as long as possible. Stay rear facing until your child has outgrown the car seat by weight or height. Many children will be able to take advantage of this safer ride beyond age 2 or even 3.

Children may be secured in a properly fitted seat belt at age 8 (regardless of weight) OR at 80 pounds (regardless of age), whichever comes first. Placing the shoulder belt under a child's (or adult's) arm or behind the back is both dangerous and illegal.

If you suspect your child has a developmental delay or a disability, don't wait to ask for support!

IMMUNIZATIONS

Let's keep our kids safe!

North Carolina law requires every child to have a basic series of immunizations. In order for child care centers and schools to maintain compliance with the immunization laws, it is necessary to have a copy of an updated immunization record or immunization card endorsed by a registered nurse, physician, or clinic within 30-days of enrollment on file at the child care center or school. If a child is exempt from vaccination because of



medical condition or religious objection, this should be noted on the immunization certificate and supported in the child's file with documentation from the physician or religious authority.

All children in North Carolina are required to be vaccinated against:

Diphtheria Hepatitis B Hib Disease Measles
Meningococcal Mumps Pertussis (whooping cough)

Pneumococcal Polio Rubella

Tetanus Varicella (chickenpox)

The CDC also recommends children be vaccinated against the following diseases, although immunization against these diseases is not required for children in North Carolina:

Hepatitis A Influenza Rotavirus Human Papillomavirus

Safe Sleep



Creating a safe sleep environment means you are minimizing your baby's risk of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) and other sleep-related causes of infant death.

Here are the basic guidelines*:

- Use a firm sleep surface, such as a waterproof mattress in a safety-approved crib, covered by a fitted sheet.
- Do not use pillows, blankets, sheepskins, or crib bumpers in baby's sleep area.
- · Keep soft objects, toys, and loose bedding out of the sleep area.
- · Do not smoke or let anyone smoke around infants.
- Make sure nothing covers the baby's head.
- · Always place infants on their backs to sleep for naps and at night.
- Put infants to sleep in light clothing, such as a one-piece sleeper, and do not use a blanket.
- Infants should NEVER sleep in an adult bed, on a couch, or on a chair, alone or with anyone else.
- Tummy time is important for building strong arm and neck muscles, but <u>only</u> when your baby is awake and supervised.



I'm Going to Kindergarten!

Helping your family create a successful beginning to school

Families are the most vital support system for young children. You are the key to successful experiences at school. Although we know you may be feeling some anxiety, we know that you and your child will discover that kindergarten is truly something to smile about!

Eligibility:

By NC state law, children are eligible for kindergarten if they turn 5 on or before August 31st.

Where is my school?

You can visit or call an elementary school close to your home and ask. You can also find out your school district by going to http://gis.catawbascountnc.gov/school and type in your home address.

What skills will help my child adjust well to kindergarten?

- Showing an interest in learning new things
- · Being willing to join in new activities.
- Showing consideration for the feelings of others.
- Being able to adjust when things don't go right.
- Expressing ideas and feelings clearly most of the time.
- · Asking for help when they really need it.

Top 10 Tips for Success in School

- 1. Read to your child EVERY day!
- 2. Visit your child's elementary school to meet the principal, eat lunch in the cafeteria, and get a tour of the school building. Be sure to attend your screening days and parent orientations.
- 3. Establish a regular bedtime and morning routine and stick to it. Don't wait ... start now.
- 4. Use counting in daily activities (steps to your house, pieces of silverware on the table, etc.)
- 5. Take your child with you to run errands at the grocery store, post office, and discuss what you see, hear and touch.
- 6. Visit your public library and check out some new books about kindergarten. Read together!
- 7. Let your child practice their independence by allowing them to make some choices. "Do you want a banana or an apple?" Encourage them to try new things.
- 8. Set a limit to the amount of "screen time" your child has a day. (Pediatricians recommend no more than 1 hour per day, including phone, TV, computer & video games.)
- 9. Have a quiet place in your home for your child to work independently with materials like crayons, scissors, and pencils. Encourage them to investigate and practice with these materials.
- 10. Help your child to begin to learn your address and phone number, how to button and zip their clothes,

5 Key Steps to Triple P's Positive Parenting:

Create a safe, interesting environment. Bored kids are likely to misbehave, and bored teenagers may find trouble. Create an environment that keeps your child entertained with healthy, age-appropriate activities. Remove potential dangers from the home and teach basic safety.

Have a positive learning environment. When your children come to you for help or a chat, they're ready to learn. Give them positive attention, even if only for a short period. Encourage them to share their ideas and opinions, and play or read with your children often.

Use assertive discipline. Set clear rules and boundaries and follow through with fair consequences. You can negotiate some with older kids and decide on rules together. Praise little and big kids when you observe the behaviors you want to see.

Have realistic expectations. Nobody's perfect – kids or adults – so don't expect behaviors that are beyond your child's age or developmental range. All parents make mistakes sometimes too.

Take care of yourself as a parent. It's all about balance. Make sure you are getting some support, time with friends, and maybe a little time to yourself. And our local Triple P seminars and groups are a great way to find parenting encouragement and meet other families!
