# 2020-2021 Board of Directors

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Dolly Parton's Imagination Library program mailed **65,119** books to Catawba County children between July 2020 - June 2021.

**5,432** children were enrolled as of June 30, 2021, representing 65% of our birth-age 5 population!



# - Program highlights from our Smart Start funded projects -

Catawba County Partnership for Children worked regularly refilled

Little Free Libraries in various locations across our county.

Members of the Early Childhood Support Team provided technical assistance to 54

child care programs in order to improve or maintain high quality care for Catawba County's children.

Parents as Teachers started a new PEEPs (Parents Encouraging & Engaging Parents) Playgroup at Open Door Baptist Church

> Children's Resource Center provided child care referrals and consumer education referrals to 332

> > parents & caregivers.

KidsREADy Catawba and Children's Resource Center designed a training for early educators called "Imagining Equity" focused on teaching children about equity through the use of carefully selected children's books.

Early Childhood Support Team's Nurses provided individualized health care plans for 115

children in child care, to help support their teachers with health issues like asthma, food allergies, and diabetes.

Children's Resource Center provided critical professional development to

early childhood educators.

Early Childhood Support Team's Clinical Specialists provided ongoing individualized mental health services to

142

children, working with 152 parents and 20 child care programs.

## 332

income-eligible children received child care subsidies, allowing them to attend full-time high quality child care programs.

Based on parent survey responses 97%

of parents reported that their child's enthusiasm for books had increased thanks to their participation in the Imagination Library program.

Triple P "Positive Parenting Program" seminars were provided to

27

group connection events this year, including some virtual and some outdoor, involving 53 participating parents

### Parents as Teachers provided 819

home visits, working with parents and children together to develop critical skill building and positive interactions. (most provided virtually due to COVID-19.)

KidsREADy Catawba designed and created "Learning at Home" backpacks for the NC Prekindergarten children to use on days when they couldn't be at school due to COVID. 468 children received puzzles, manipulatives, books, and age appropriate activities.

Early Childhood Support Team Nurses provided critical health & safety training to

early childhood professionals, including CPR/First Aid, ITS SIDS, Emergency Preparedness, and Infectious Disease.
