At the beginning of the kindergarten year, your child's teacher will observe what your child knows and how your child learns. This <u>document</u> shares more about this process, called NC-ELI (NC Early Learning Inventory).

During the kindergarten year, your child should be actively engaged in learning, usually through teacher designed activities that look like "play." Five-year-olds are not ready to sit for long periods of time but should be up and moving about as they learn, often in "learning centers."
