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Catawba County Partnership for Children works to ensure that children receive the support and services they need prior to kindergarten. In Catawba County, there are 10,146 children from birth to age five. CCPC is the primary convener for early childhood programming in our community. Dolly Parton's Imagination Library program mailed **66,19** books to Catawba County children between July 2023 - June 2024.

5,490 children were enrolled as of June 30, 2024, representing **54.1%** of our birth-age 4 population.



Program Highlights

Supporting Children and their Families

- Imagination Library mailed out books to 7,094 children throughout the year (July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024).
- Our Nest Diaper Pantry gave out 37,899 diapers, serving 374 families with emergency diaper needs and additional referrals.
- The Early Childhood Support Team provided car seat safety assistance to 305 families, ensuring the safety of their young children.

Supporting Parents and Caregivers

- The Children's Resource Center provided child care referrals to 253 parents and guardians, equipping them with the knowledge needed to make informed decisions for their children's care
- Through Triple P (Positive Parenting Program), 29 parents participated in Level 4 parent education groups, gaining advanced strategies to support their child's development and address challenging behaviors.
- Parents as Teachers educators provided 1,619 home visits with 101 parents and guardians, offering personalized guidance and support to strengthen family relationships and promote healthy early childhood development.
- PEEPs (Parent Engaging and Empowering Parents) Playgroups offered 68 weekly playgroups for children and their caregivers in three different locations (Long View, Kenworth, and Ridgeview communities), providing opportunities for socialization, learning and community engagement.
- Child Care Subsidy provided financial assistance for 351 families in Catawba County, helping them to afford high quality child care.

Supporting our Child Care Community

- Early Childhood Support Team Nurses provided critical health & safety training to 349 early childhood professionals, including CPR/First Aid, ITS SIDS, Emergency Preparedness, and Infectious Disease.
- Early Childhood Support Team Nurses conducted 4,220 health consultations with staff and child care directors, ensuring the well-being and safety of children in child care facilities throughout the county.
- Early Childhood Support Team's Education Specialists provided additional early childhood education support to 499 child care staff, further enhancing their professional development and the quality of child care in Catawba County.
- Early Childhood Support Team Clinicians provided mental health services to 107 children in 37 different child care facilities.
- The Children's Resource Center provided workshops and trainings to 382 early childhood teachers.
